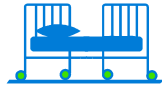

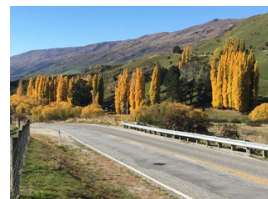

You are a prisoner sentenced to death. The Emperor offers you a chance to live by playing a simple game:

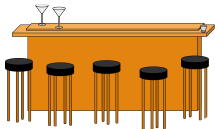

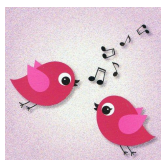
